Our core curriculum

Our children make good progress from their starting point, both academically and socially, so they are ready to take their next step in education.

An ambitious curriculum

Designed to encourage children to embrace their natural curiosity, to question and understand the world around them whilst appreciating their role within it.

Rich and meaningful learning experiences

Delivered through a broad and relevant curriculum which acknowledges the importance of Literacy and Numeracy whilst also promoting the wider creative subjects, widening pupils' experiences and understanding of their world.

Learn to read, read to learn

Reading is central to our curriculum design allowing children to explore different authors and genres, enrich vocabulary and develop a love of reading for pleasure.

Underpinned by British Values

Lessons are designed to encourage an awareness and growth of essential life skills, enabling children to develop and become valuable citizens of their local and global community, with an awareness and understanding of British values.

Learning extends far beyond the classroom. Through a broad range of enrichment activities, our children learn to challenge themselves and grow in creativity and resilience.

School trips and visits

Children experience a variety of trips, both locally and further afield, to support their learning.

Extra help when it's needed

Our Parent Support Advisor and Mental Health Support Team are here to assist families and children, and we have excellent partnerships with external professionals to seek advice when it is needed.

The Bridge, our resource provision, allows children who have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP) with communication and interaction as their primary need to receive appropriate personalised teaching. Children continue to access mainstream classrooms and curriculum whilst belonging to a class group.

We have a breakfast club and afterschool club, extending the school day to between 8am and 5pm.

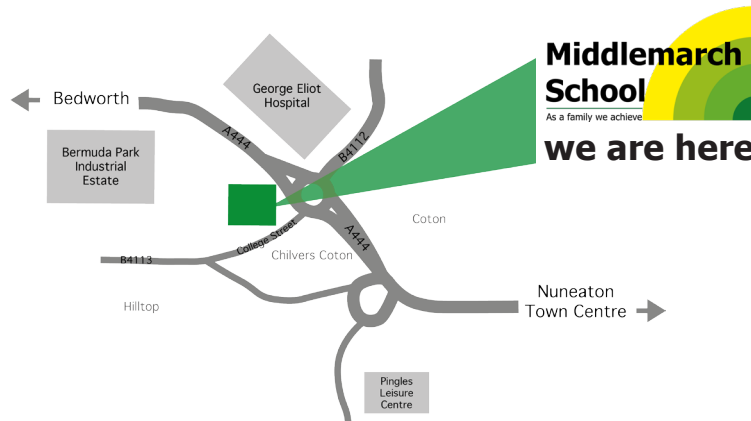
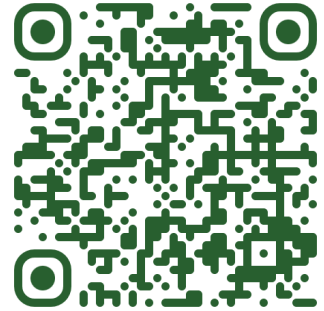

Some of us start at 8am, because we come to breakfast club, where we can play with our friends before school.



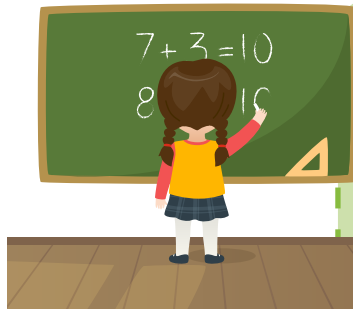
English

For the first part of our day, we will do English work, reading stories and writing our own.



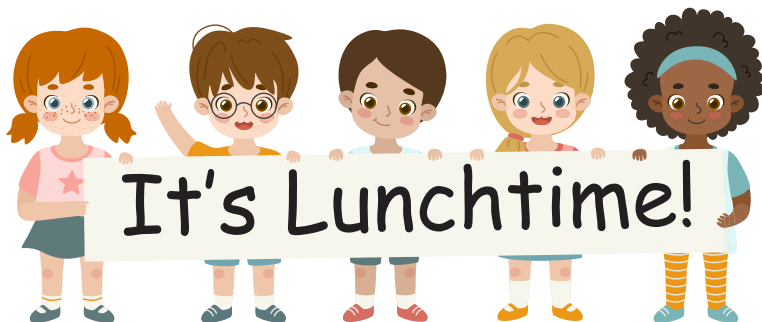
Maths

After breaktime it's maths, where we practice our number skills and solve problems.



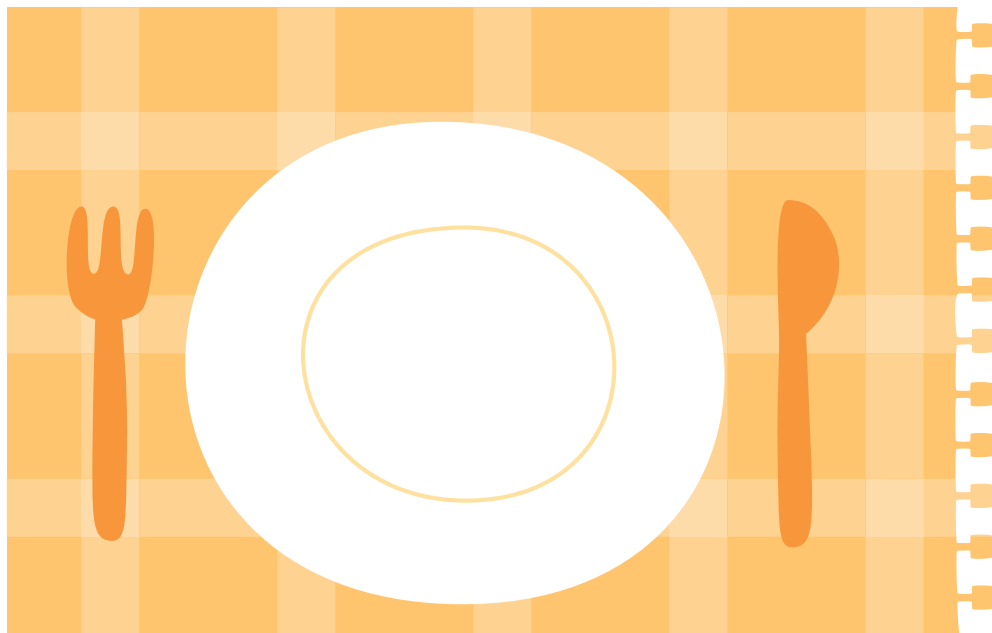
Can you answer this sum?
